The Initiative

- Only applies to Parks and Community Service Amenities
- “Community Service Amenities” are defined in section 2.07.030 (d) (1) of the text of the initiative

2.07.030 (d) (1) “Community Service Amenities”

- *“...facilities and the land on which the facilities stand, whose primary purpose is to provide the public a place of city government administration, recreation, education, exercise, or enjoyment.”*

The “swap” consisted of two separate transactions:

1. Former Armory
(seasonal cold weather shelter)
2. Former Onizuka Air Force Station

Cold-Weather Shelter

- Would the Armory Cold Weather Shelter have qualified as a Community Service Amenity *within the scope of this initiative?*

Armory Cold-Weather Shelter

City government administration? **NO**

Onizuka Air Force Station

- Does the Onizuka Air Force Station qualify as a Community Service Amenity *within the scope of this initiative?*

Onizuka Air Force Station

City government administration? **NO**

Public Recreation? **NO**

Public Education? **NO**

Public Exercise? **NO**

Public Enjoyment? **NO**

The Truth

- The Armory cold weather shelter would **NOT** have qualified as a Community Service Amenity
- The Onizuka Air Force Station property does **NOT** qualify as a Community Service Amenity

F.U.D. #3

"The Sunnyvale Public Lands Act would prevent the City from allowing Santa Clara County to use the Onizuka site for a Temporary Cold Weather Shelter beyond one year (2015-2016 season)."

This is FALSE!

The Truth

- **Neither** a cold weather shelter **nor** the Onizuka Air Force Station qualify as a Community Service Amenity
- The Sunnyvale Public Lands Act **does not** impede the city's ability to create a new cold weather shelter
